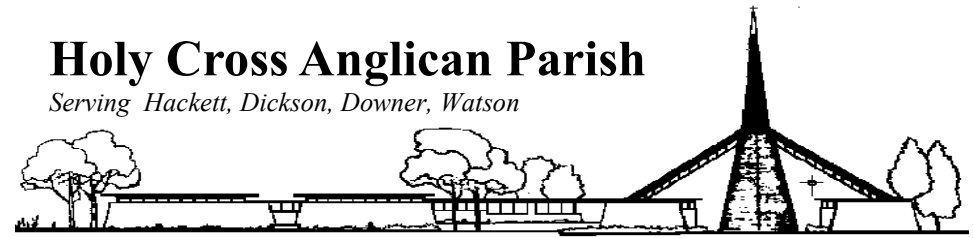

Last Sunday after the Epiphany Transfiguration 15th February 2015

The Rector Writes

Dear Friends,

A very warm welcome as we come together for our worship on this Sunday morning. Today brings us to the end of the Sundays we observe 'after the Epiphany' and so it brings us to the threshold of Lent. It is a day when our attention is turned to the Transfiguration of Christ. May God's glory fill our eyes, our hearts and our lives as we worship this week.

Today's gospel passage, which tells of the Transfiguration of Jesus, is found right in the middle of Mark's Gospel, yet it reminds us of the passage back at the beginning, in chapter 1, where we read of Jesus being baptised. These two stories, of baptism and transfiguration, 'bracket' the season of Epiphany: we read the baptismal story back on the first Sunday after the Epiphany, and now we read the transfiguration story on the last Sunday. They are two stories that Mark tells that are revealing stories about Jesus' unique identity as the one in whom shone the divine light of the presence of God. The Transfiguration story declares for us that what the disciples saw in the face of Jesus was the glory of God.

The Transfiguration also points towards the journey Jesus will make to Jerusalem - and beyond, to resurrection. We are about to embark on our Lenten journey. Before we do, though, today we take a few moments to reflect on our own growth as persons of faith during the past year, and then I encourage you strongly to take the Lenten journey seriously: be frequent in attending worship, use our study groups, the Quiet Day, and make some special endeavours of your own, so that we might all grow in our life of faith and live a little more fully and clearly the love of God in our lives.

God richly bless you this week and throughout this Lent.

St John's Care

I have advised the Rector of St John's and the Management Committee of St John's Care that I will retire on 17 July this year. Being the Director of SJC has been a real privilege and has been a fantastic 7 years (this time). I have made so many friends and I think I have helped a lot of people, but it is now time to start the next stage of my life – retirement! One of the things I have learnt in my time as Director is that Canberra is not the affluent city that people think it is, and it is not an even playing field out there. So many Canberra families have a hard time surviving. They need support to make ends meet and I am pleased that St John's Care is able to provide it. But we can't do that without you, so thank you for your generosity.

Zack, our Youth Worker, is dealing with a young lad, I call Fred, who is in a difficult situation. He is 16, in his first year at College, and wants to complete Year 12. He seems a nice kid - quiet and intelligent. After his parents separated he lived 2 weeks with Mum and then 2 weeks with Dad. His mum moved interstate, so he has been staying with his Dad for the last year. He doesn't want to go back to his Mum and other half-siblings, in fact he would rather live on the streets. His Dad, who has struggled for years with mental health issues and drug and alcohol addiction, now feels that his home is no longer a safe place for Fred. So what happens now? Zack is exploring options for him, but there are not many available. YouthCARE Canberra is such an important program. It stops kids falling through the cracks. I hope that I will be able to continue this story another time and I hope that it will have a happy ending.

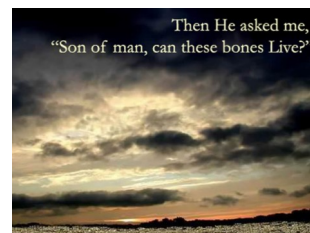
